RULES AND CONDITIONS FOR USE OF MORRIS RANGES

1. Only .22 rimfire target ammunition may be used. (No high velocity, hollow point etc.)
2. Breech plugs must be inserted or actions removed between details and when rifles are uncased.
3. Target boards are provided for use on the main range for single card and 3 card system targets at 50 metres and 100 yards and must be used only for these targets.
4. You may provide your own hardboard or Correx target boards if you wish to shoot at other targets within the permitted distances - which must be measured from the target, not the firing point. Target boards must be fixed to the frame which corresponds with the firing point number.
5. The target frames must not be moved under any circumstances. Damage can be caused to the frames by miss-alignment.
6. All shooters must write their names clearly in the attendance register, with the name of their club and status. Range fees must be paid to the Range Officer if a season ticket has not been purchased.
7. All shooting must be carried out under the control of the Range Officer i.e. a minimum of two people required when shooting is undertaken.
8. Novice shooters are only allowed to use the ranges when under close personal supervision of a responsible fire-arm certificate holder who must ensure that no inconvenience or distraction is caused to other shooters.
9. All shooting must be controlled by a Range Officer (for range officer duties see a separate sheet). A Deputy Range Officer is required for duty if the main range and the 50 metres range are both in use.
10. Range Officers, appointed or self-appointed by opening the ranges, must record their names as Range Officers in the attendance register with times of duty and discharge the Range Officers' responsibilities.
11. Only persons engaged in shooting activity and Range Officers may be on the firing point when details are in progress. Preparation of equipment and target boards should be conducted quietly behind the firing point or between details. A Range Officer's view of the shooting must not be impeded by non-shooting persons on the firing point.
12. Airgun target shooting is allowed when ranges are not in use for cartridge shooting. Range Officers must impose sensible requirements for safety and protection of range equipment.
